David Herlihy

Barnaby Conrad and Mary Critchfield Keeney Professor and Professor of History Brown University

Professor Herlihy has been president of the Medieval Academy of America (1982-83), the Society for Italian Historical Studies (1981-83), the New England Medieval Conference (1980-81), and the Midwest Medieval Conference (1970-71). He is a Fellow of the American Academy of the Arts and Sciences and the Medieval Academy of America. Among his many distinguished publications are Medieval Households (1985) and Cities and Society in Medieval Italy (1980). In his address to the plenary session, Professor Herlihy will discuss the interpretation of names as a way of understanding medieval popular culture.
